

Highway 99: Lillooet to Whistler

- Load restricted to 14,500 kg L.G.V.W, 4.7 m height restriction
- This is a safe highway, but drivers must drive to conditions
- Obey speed limits and adhere to curve advisory speed signs
- Pay attention to snow removal equipment
- Mountainous road that can see large temperature swings and sudden change in weather
- Conditions can change quickly, have sufficient supplies available
- No cell service in this corridor
- No rest areas in this corridor
- Numerous avalanche paths. Obey no stopping signs. Road may close with limited notice
- 60 km/h advisory for corridor
- No Electric Vehicle Charging stations between Mt Currie to Lillooet
- Watch for rockfall

ITEMS TO NOTE!

- 100-km distance, two-lane highway with no passing lanes, limited passing opportunities and many tight curves as low as 20 km/hr
- Several single-lane bridges
- Limited brake checks, rest areas and stopping areas
- Grades of up to 15% – gear down
- No fuel, food or cell service between Mt. Currie and Lillooet
- No parking along Hwy 99 as this impedes snow removal and is unsafe. Vehicles will be towed.
